#### Successful Longevity Position Announcement (Job ID 38083)

The School of Communication Science and Disorders at Florida State University invites applications for the position of Assistant Professor beginning Fall 2016. Qualifications for the Assistant Professor rank include: (a) earned doctorate in communication science and disorders or related areas, (b) experience in teaching and research, and (c) clinical certification is preferred, but not required. This is a full-time, tenure-track position, with a 9-month appointment; academic year requirements include teaching at the undergraduate and/or graduate level, research and service. The position is intended to support the University's initiative in the area of successful longevity. The faculty member in this position is expected to collaborate with other researchers in the Institute for Successful Longevity [http://psy.fsu.edu/tsg/isl\\_2/](http://psy.fsu.edu/tsg/isl_2/).

Applicants with expertise in areas such as communication and aging, neurogenetics, gerontology, dysphagia, and/or AAC are encouraged to apply. Applicants should have a strong research background and evidence of the potential for obtaining external support for research and training activities. Successful candidates will be expected to develop internationally recognized, externally funded research programs, teach in the undergraduate and graduate curricula, and participate in service activities in the School, College and University.

Florida State University is classified by the Carnegie Foundation as a very high research activity institution with outstanding research facilities and infrastructure support. In addition, the state of Florida has recognized Florida State University as one of two preeminent research universities in the state. The School of Communication Science and Disorders is in the College of Communication and Information at Florida State University. Students can earn bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. The master's program includes both on-campus and distance learning cohorts. The School is ranked in the top 25 nationally. The environment is highly collaborative with faculty members who have intersecting research interests that include many aspects of clinical, translational, and basic research. The School is located in a newly remodeled stand-alone building with ample space for faculty, research laboratories, and diverse clinical programs. There is an on-site speech, language and hearing clinic that services Tallahassee and the surrounding counties, and development of a specialty clinic dedicated to the assessment and treatment of specific clinical populations (e.g., recent veterans) is presently underway.
